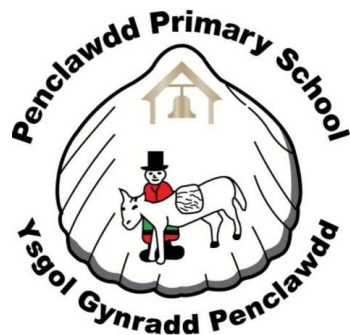




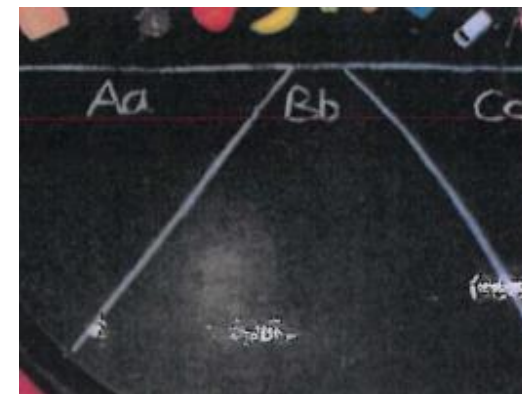
Fill a tray/plate with shaving foam. Give your child some sounds or words to practise writing using their finger.



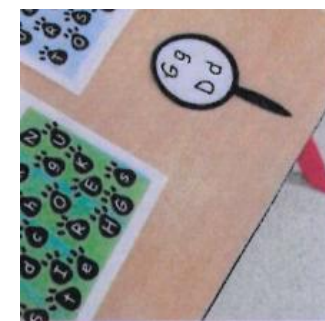
Splat- This game can be played either with sounds or words. Write different sounds or words on post its and place on a table. Say either the sound or word that your child needs to find. They then splat that word as fast as they can.



Using different colours, children practise writing sounds or words on a shed, the patio, windows, chalkboards or any writing surface you have available. Whiteboard pen and chalk pens work well on windows and clean off easily with a little help. The aim is to listen for the sound or word you call out and then write it as many times as they can in one minute.



Choose two or more sounds to play a sorting game. Find lots of items around the house beginning with those sounds. Ask your child to sort the items by the sound that they begin with.



Play 'I spy with my little eye something that sounds like c-oo-t.
